#### A Share in the New Covenant

"Today, the second Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate a second solemnity, which marks our return to Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar. Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. At one time, this day was called *Corpus Christi*, the Latin words for "the Body of Christ." In the most recent revision of our liturgical rites, the name for this day is expanded to be a more complete reflection of our Eucharistic theology.

The Gospel of Mark describes Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples as a celebration of the Jewish feast of Passover. In the description of the Passover meal found in today's Gospel, however, Mark omits many elements of the Jewish Passover meal. Instead, he describes only those elements he believes to be most essential to the Christian Eucharist: Jesus took bread, blessed the bread, broke the bread, and shared it with his disciples. Similar words and actions follow as Jesus shares the chalice with his disciples. This bread now shared is Jesus' own body. Those who drink from the chalice are invited to share in a new covenant which will be sealed by Jesus' own blood. Mark's Eucharistic theology looks forward to the Kingdom of God that Jesus inaugurates.

The Gospel for today reminds us that the Eucharist is a memorial of Christ's sacrifice on the cross. We believe that Jesus is truly present to us in the elements of bread and wine. Each time we celebrate this sacrament, we prepare for the Kingdom of God. This celebration, as the Second Vatican Council taught us, is the source and summit of the Christian life."

#### St. Peter's Cathedral Parking

All parking for masses remains unchanged.

#### Weekday Mass Parking

- South parking lot this is the lot closest to Dufferin Ave.
- On street metered parking check meters and signs for fees.

#### Weekend Mass Parking

- South and middle parking lots (Saturday and Sunday).
- North parking lot (Sunday only from 8:15 am until 11:15 am).
- On street metered parking check meters and signs for fees.

Parking for Saturday reconciliation, weddings and funerals is available in the south and middle parking lots.

HONK parking is being implemented in the north lot only. Parking in the north lot on Saturdays, Sunday afternoons and weeknights is available to parishioners and the public for a fee.

#### St. Michael's Parish Parking

Please <u>do not park</u> in front of the Rectory garage at any time. Priests need access to the garage throughout the day and evening, both weekends and weekdays, for mass at St. Peter's Cathedral, school and nursing home visits, hospital calls and meetings. The Priests have been blocked in on several occasions.

#### Weekday Mass Parking

- Rear parking along the fence. Parking next to the school is for school staff only Monday Friday, 8 am 4 pm from Sept. 1 to June 30.
- On street parking and in front of the Parish. Check meters and signs for fees.


#### St. Michael's CWL

Dr. Ben Akers sits down with Dr. Elizabeth Klein to discuss St. Justin Martyr-an early Church martyr who lived from about AD 100 to 165 and wrote several significant



Christian apologetic works. St. Justin was a convert to the Catholic faith, philosopher, and is famous for his idea of the "seeds of the Word" found throughout all of God's creation.

St. Justin explains that all things are created by God and that there are seeds of God's truth found in all things. This allows Justin to confidently seek the truth present in other philosophies and even the pagan myths and draw out what is true and good and relate it to the Word-Jesus Christ.
