





#### Anniversary of the Dedication of St. Peter's Cathedral Basilica - June 28th

"The importance of the cathedral church in the liturgical life of the Diocese flows from



the role of the Bishop as high Priest of the Lord's flock. Every parish community is related to the Bishop, therefore the anniversary of the cathedral church's dedication as a of worship is celebrated throughout diocese." (Constitution of the Sacred Liturgy, nos 41-42)

This year we mark the 139<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the dedication of St. Peter's Cathedral. Five years after the turning of the first sod in 1880, the new St. Peter's Cathedral was formally opened and dedicated by Bishop John Walsh, second Bishop of London on the vigil of the Solemnity of St. Peter & St. Paul, June 28, 1885.

#### **Prayer for the Anniversary of the Dedication of St. Peter's Cathedral**

O God, who year by year renew for us the day when this, your holy temple was consecrated, hear the prayers of your people and grant that in this place for you there may always be pure worship and for us, fullness of redemption. In this visible house that you have let us build and where you never cease to show favour to the family on pilgrimage to you in this place, You wonderfully accomplish the mystery of your communion with us.

Here you build up for yourself the temple that we are and cause your Church, spread throughout the world, to grow ever more and more as the Lord's own Body, till she reaches her fullness in the vision of peace, the heavenly city of Jerusalem.

May we continue to be sustained by the intercession of the blessed Apostle St. Peter, our patron saint through whom you gave your church the foundations of her heavenly office so through him we may have eternal salvation. Amen.

#### Solemnity of St. Peter and St. Paul, June 29th

June 29th marks the feast day of St. Peter and St. Paul. On this day we recognize the patron saint of one of our parishes in the London North Central Catholic Family of Parishes and the Diocesan cathedral. We also join in prayer with the Anglican Diocese of Huron and neighbour to St. Peter's Cathedral, St. Paul's Cathedral.

"Two great Apostles of the Gospel and two pillars of the Church: Peter and Paul. Dear brothers and sisters, the Church looks to these two giants of faith and sees two Apostles who set free the power of the Gospel in our world, only because first they themselves had been set free by their encounter with Christ. Jesus did not judge them or humiliate them. Instead, he shared their life with affection and closeness. He supported them by his prayer, and even at times reproached them to make them change. To Peter, Jesus gently says: "I have prayed for you that your own faith may not fail" (Lk 22:32). And to Paul: "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" (Acts 9:4). He does the same with us: he assures us of his closeness by praying and interceding for us

before the Father, and gently reproaching us whenever we go astray, so that we can find the strength to arise and resume the journey.

Peter and Paul bequeath to us the image of a Church entrusted to our hands, yet guided by the Lord with fidelity and tender love, for it is he

who guides the Church. A Church that is weak, yet finds strength in the presence of God. The image of a Church set free and capable of offering the world the freedom that the world by itself cannot give: freedom from sin and death, from resignation, and from the sense of injustice and the loss of hope that dehumanizes the lives of the women and men of our time."

#### **Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus**



On June 7<sup>th</sup>, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. In our tradition, the month of June is devoted to the Sacred Heart. Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back

centuries. It is, of course, rooted in Sacred Scripture's numerous depictions of God's love for humankind.

Pope Pius XII promulgated an encyclical in 1956, Haurietis Aquas, "On Devotion to the Sacred Heart". Pius XII offers wonderful meditations on the connection between the Sacred Heart and other elements of Catholic faith, such as the Incarnation (including Jesus's divine and human love), the gift of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the Most Holy Eucharist, among others. He also describes the essence and purpose of this devotion, saying:

"...of its very nature, [it] is a worship of the love with which God, through Jesus, loved us, and at the same time, an exercise of our own love by which we are related to God and to other men. Or to express it in another way, devotion of this kind is directed towards the love of God for us in order to adore it, give thanks for it, and live so as to imitate it; it has this view, as the end to be attained, that we bring that love by which we are bound to God to the rest of men to perfect fulfillment by carrying out daily more eagerly the new commandment which the divine Master gave to His Apostles as a sacred legacy when He said: 'A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another as I have loved you.""(107)

#### **Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus**

O most holy heart of Jesus, fountain of every blessing, I adore you, I love you, and with lively sorrow for my sins, I offer you this poor heart of mine.

Make me humble, patient, pure and wholly obedient to your will.

Grant, good Jesus, that I may live in you and for you.

Protect me in the midst of danger.

Give me health of body, assistance in my temporal needs, your blessing on all that I do, and the grace of a holy death.

Amen.

Comfort me in my afflictions.



#### St. Peter's St. Vincent de Paul Society Update


This past May, St. Peter's Saint Vincent de Paul Society made 52 visits to help 66 people who asked for our assistance. Gift cards worth \$3360 were given to them as well as vouchers from our York St. store for furniture, clothing and household items. Our assistance is always met with gratitude; your generosity is invariably appreciated.

We have also been able to make a donation towards construction of a new building that will be dedicated to making affordable housing available to Londoners with low incomes. This initiative is being organized by the St. Vincent de Paul Particular Council Affordable Housing Project

One of our volunteers has provided this reflection on the work she has been doing with the disadvantaged in our core area:

"As a volunteer with the St. Vincent de Paul, I encounter many people who are so grateful for the fellowship and services we provide. I recently had the good fortune to meet a young man who had finally secured a safe place to live after many years of living on the streets of London. The pride he had in his new home was heartwarming to witness. We were able to provide him with a gift card for groceries and a voucher for clothes from the St. Vincent de Paul store on York Street. This was certainly a good news encounter."
