Looking to the future with unshakable faith

In the letter to the Hebrews 11:1, faith is described as the "assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." As we look

to the future, this description of faith invites us to exhibit two qualities, namely, confidence and certainty in our daily living. We are to be confident of who God says He is, and we are to be certain that God will do what He says.

With summer winding down, we prepare to move to another season, embracing different activities and new routines. The transition, from one season to another, is a natural part of life. However, adapting to another season and taking up our routines and responsibilities after summer can sometimes be a source of tension, fear, anxiety and worry.

Additionally, over the summer, I have had the opportunity to speak to parents and grandparents. Many of them expressed concerns about the growing cases of hate crimes in our city, unrest in different parts of the world, inflation, and rising cost of living.

The tension, fear, anxiety and worry are real, but we can overcome them by reflecting on God's active presence in our lives and on his promises. This requires looking to the future with faith, not with fear. Often, fear is a prediction that something bad is going to happen. But faith inspires confidence certainty that it will be done to us according to God's words and promises (Luke 1:38). In Jeremiah 29:11, the Lord says: "For I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Paul tells us in Philippians 4:6: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." This is because, "we live by faith, not by sight" (2 Cor. 5:7).

As we embrace another season, picking up our routines and responsibilities, let us approach it with unshakable faith, trusting in God's plan and promises for us. Psalm 125:1 says: "Those who trust in the LORD are like Mount Zion, which cannot be shaken but endures forever". Let us be confident that no matter what is going on around us, God's Word has the final authority. It is the same yesterday, today and forever. God never abandons his people. We can hear Him say to us: "Be still and know that I am God" (Ps 46:10).

Below is a list of activities planned for this fall:

- 1. **Western Fair Booth.** From September 6 September 15. Volunteers commit 3 hours to work at our booth with a display that illustrates the beauty of the life growing in the womb of a mother. There are always 2 or more people working together at the booth. All volunteers get free entrance to the Western Fair.
- 2. **40 Days for Life** Join in silent prayer for mothers and babies in danger for 40 days this fall. Our Family of Parishes will be in charge of attendance for all the Wednesdays during the 40 days of the event, from September 25 to November 3. Everyone is welcome to come for an hour or any time you are available. We hope to fill the corner of Wellington and Commissioner every Wednesday during the event, near the site of Victoria Hospital where an average of 15 abortions take place every week. You will meet amazing people and save many lives.
- 3. **4LifeLondon Annual Gala**. The keynote speaker is Abby Johnson; the person on whom the movie *Unplanned* is based. Abby is a former director of a Planned Parenthood facility. After she saw and was involved firsthand in what was happening, she was not able to continue working there. Abby is now a passionate pro-life advocate. Tickets to the gala are \$75 per person.
- 4. **Chain for Life.** One hour of prayer along Wellington and Commissioners. Sunday October 6 from 2-3PM. This is a one time get together to pray for mothers' and babies' safety and well being.
